

Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue service are offering to deliver a joint workshop with the British Red Cross which will focus on kitchen safety (including kitchen/pan fires) and dealing with burns and scalds for KS2 pupils.



Inspiring IAG Award – this award can help your school to deliver and gain recognition for good quality careers, information, advice and guidance. Following a Pilot programme that started in September 2014 two of our Trust schools (Churchill Community College and Seaton Burn College) have completed Stage 2 of the Award. We are now encouraging more secondary schools from North Tyneside to become 'Careers Champions' and are inviting expressions of interest from any school who may wish to consider taking part. The offer to schools is:

- Completion of a unique Level 6 qualification covering three key areas of Careers Delivery and Design.
- A dedicated Mentor linked to the school to support the member of staff from the school whilst completing the Inspiring Careers IAG Quality Award to stages 1, 2 and 3.
- Access to a comprehensive website with on-line resources to support the school as it works towards becoming a 'careers champion'.
- The first two years of the licence costs to use the Inspiring Careers branding.

The cost to schools is approximately:

- Level 6 Award: £650
- Inspiring Careers IAG Quality Award: Stage 1 (£175); Stage 2 (£235); Stage 3 (£905)

A Trust bursary is available to cover the cost of entry and the school will need to cover a staff member's time to attend a minimum of 5 days of learning across a school year, to be delivered by the Connexions Hub Training services from their central Gateshead office.

Following the success of our 2015 course, The Dove Marine laboratory, Newcastle University is hosting an introductory course to Marine Science later this year. The date of the course will be **Monday to Friday, 24th - 28th October 2016.** The week long course, is aimed at **Year 11 to 13 students** who have a keen interest in Marine Science.

The purpose of the experience is:

- Inform bright young scientists about the study of marine science and relating degrees
- Be inspired by leading experts and personalities who are passionate about Marine Science and related STEM industries. Making pupils aware of the careers and opportunities within the marine sector
- Benefit from sessions on the University application process, financial support, and careers advice tailored towards STEM related learning, qualifications and professions

The Trust are excited to announce the new Genomics Hub with an exciting range of activities on offer for Key stage 2 and 3.

The Trust have secured 2 lead teachers to come into schools for a half day to lead on activities to enable children to learn more about their genes, the genetic code and why genetics are important. The session can involve an assembly, class activities with practical hands on learning plus support with planning with teachers for future sessions

Schools signing up for the activities **must** also be able to come to the planning session after the initial classroom session. Please see dates below.

Key Stage 2 Offer

A 30 minute assembly on 'What makes us ...us?' An introduction to genetics, their importance, and some of the work that scientists do. Can be linked to Jeans for Genes if relevant.

Where possible, a STEM ambassador will also join us to talk about their work in this area.

Practical activities of:

- Making DNA out of sweets. This exercise introduces children to the structure of DNA, and gives clues to help them discover how to make a model themselves. (30 minutes)
- Extracting DNA from fruit. This practical activity allows children to follow a scientific method to extract DNA themselves. *Safety goggles must be worn*. (1 hour)
- What's your number? Pupils use a tool to identify some common characteristics, then see how similar or not they are to their classmates. Done in a safe and non-threatening way, links can be made to numeracy and PSHE. (1 hour)
- Making a DNA bracelet. Pupils follow the genetic code to make their own bracelet of a gene from a real living plant or animal! (30 minutes)

Key Stage 3 Offer

A 30 minute assembly on 'What makes us ...us?' Information on genetics, their importance, and some of the work that scientists do such as genetic engineering, screening, and some of the ethics around this. Can be linked to Jeans for Genes if relevant.

Where possible, a STEM ambassador will also join us to talk about their work in this area.

Practical activities of:

- Genetic engineering. Pupils follow a scientific method to transfer a gene into bacteria, and identify whether this has been successful. The theory of this will be explained, and modern uses discussed and debated. (1 hour.)
- BLAST. Pupils are introduced to this website used by geneticists to discover where certain genes are found. They investigate 'newly discovered' genes, and where else they may be found. (30 minutes.)
- Genetic debate. We can test for genes for characteristics and diseases, and we can move genes from one living thing to another (e.g. glow in the dark rabbits!) but is this right, and are there any drawbacks? In this debate, pupils will research some current issues, then debate the ethics around the science. (1 hour.)
- What's your number? Pupils use a tool to identify some common characteristics, then see how similar or not they are to their classmates. Done in a safe and non threatening way, links can be made to numeracy and PSHE. (30 minutes to 1 hour.)

Planning Session – an extended twilight session

A joint session for teachers of both key stage 2 and 3. Here we will look at some key concepts and progression in the curriculum. We shall look at some cutting edge work being done, and share a range of resources for teaching genetics and taking it further. Where possible a STEM ambassador will join us for these sessions, to discuss activities in school.






