Education Psychology Research Partnership

The Trust Board is working in partnership with the Educational Psychology Service to sponsor some action research involving several Trust Primary Schools.

The research topics include 'working memory' and ADHD and will be used to support teachers in Trust partner schools to develop strategies which better support teaching and learning for children with additional needs in these areas.

The Trust is working in partnership with the local authority and has committed to fund 10 days of the 15 day research project with the local authority making available funding to support the additional 5 days.



This opportunity will include 2 outstanding teachers of biology A-level to work with the NSLC and the Sanger Institute in Cambridge to become lead teachers in genomics for Key stages 4 and 5 and a wide range of CPD and 'lead teacher' training.

IPad Band

Primary Leaders at High Borrans
