Welcome to our new Trust Schools

The Trust is delighted to welcome five new schools who joined the Trust on the 1 July 2013, raising the total number of Trust Schools to 39. This is fantastic news for the Trust as the more schools we have working together within a formal collaborative structure, supported by our employers and higher and further education partners, the greater our ability to improve education in the borough for all our children and young people.

British Airways Partnership

The Trust has been working in partnership with British Airways on a £20m bid to the UK Commission for Employment and Skills. A successful bid would see BA working in collaboration with over 100 schools across North Tyneside, London and Manchester. The bid's primary focus is on investing in young people to develop their project management and employability skills. BA also proposes to offer hundreds of traineeships, apprenticeships and work experience placements to give young people a valuable insight into the world of work. The Trust ran a series of successful meetings between representatives from BA, Trust Secondary Schools and Employer Partners, all of whom have recognised the potential benefits that this opportunity presents for young people in North Tyneside. Step Forward with STEM

The Trust, in partnership with The Smallpiece Trust, Arkwright Scholarships Trust, Engineering Development Trust (EDT) and STEMNET, four of the largest and most well established STEM educational charities in the UK, are to develop a programme of hands-on careers 5 year focussed activities designed to raise awareness of engineering as an attractive career option and inspire local children and young people to consider a career in engineering. Funding applications have been made to various companies and trusts to secure the grant funding required to launch the scheme.

A programme of engineering related activities will be run with pupils in years 9, 10, 11 and 12; they include designing and building engineering projects such as a wind turbine, work-related assignments led by role model engineers and a residential course at Newcastle University. Trust Apprenticeship Programme Success

North Tyneside Learning Trust has supported employers in North Tyneside, including many Trust Schools, to create 50 new apprenticeships for young people. The Trust covers half the salary costs by providing a bursary of £3,550. Our apprentices have brought considerable value to their place of work and have worked in a broad range of occupational areas, including engineering, mechanics, business administration and ICT. An apprentice 'Hall of Fame' has been established to help share some of our success stories and encourage more young people to consider an apprenticeship. All of our apprentices are aged 16-18 and have attended a Trust School. Many have already completed their apprenticeship and have remained in employment which is a fantastic achievement. In particular we would like to congratulate Scott Graham (above left) who completed his apprenticeship in Information and Communication Technology at Trust School Churchill Community College. Scott remains in employment at the school and was recently awarded with the title 'Apprentice of the Year 2012/13'. The Trust would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Scott on his achievement.

The Trust has agreed funding for a further 20 apprenticeships this year, with Trust Schools prioritised as employers in the first instance. STEMtastic at Tyne Met College



The Trust has been working in partnership with Tyne Met College to deliver STEMtastic 2013. Over 370 Year 6 school pupils from Trust primary schools attended STEMtastic 2013 at Tyne Met College on 10 July 2013. Students participated in a range of STEM workshops delivered by Tyne Met and Queen Alexandra Sixth Form College staff, Fabricom Offshore Ltd and The Centre for Life.

The activities ranged from learning about the stars and planets and making air propelled rockets, to discovering how to design their own IT character and learning about anatomy.

The Trust plan to work in partnership with Tyne Met College to run STEMtastic on an annual basis, building on the success of the event year on year.

Apprentice Students on Campus at Northumbria University

The Trust and Northumbria University worked together to run the University's annual 'Apprentice Students on Campus' week, as part of the University's range of aspiration raising events. Year 6

pupils from six Trust Primary Schools visited the campus for one day and were introduced to university through activities such as campus monopoly, library treasure hunt, sports activities and interaction with current university students.



Tyneside Trackers with Newcastle University

A number of pupils from Trust Schools at Seaton Burn and Churchill Community College have joined pupils from schools in Northumberland on a year long exciting programme of activities exploring careers in Science and Engineering. The project, supporting 25 pupils in total, called 'Tyneside Trackers' is being co-ordinated by staff from the Trust's partner Newcastle University and generously funded by Merck Sharp Dome Ltd. The pupils gave up their free time over the May half-term holiday to explore marine science, engineering, chemistry, study skills and the physics of colour in 'Explore Week' at the University. This month, the pupils participated in a two day programme of visits to companies such as Proctor and Gamble, Millers, and the Nissan factory to observe science and maths in action in the work place and hear about each company's recruitment process. An afternoon session followed, getting the pupils to think about how they can prepare themselves for the future workplace. Mrs Annie Russell of the Dove Mare Laboratory, Newcastle University who is leading the project said: "It is important that our young people are given opportunities to think about different careers that don't always immediately spring to mind. Tyneside Trackers will give them the freedom to think outside the box over the coming year about what they enjoy, and what they excel at."



New Literacy Support for Primary Schools
