

Background and Context:

Churchill Community College and Norham High School are taking part in the Education Challenge Pilot in the NE.

Week 6: Project Review (Checkpoint 2): Students meet with Industry Lead to receive feedback on how to improve and move on to final outcome task

Week 7: Industry Visit

Week 8 & 9 working on the task brief and milestone meeting (teacher and IAM) Prepare for showcase / project time

Week 10:Celebration and Assessment) (Checkpoint 3): Showcase and celebration of achievement - Can we inspire others through our ethical design work?
